# VILLAGE OF ATHENS BOARD MEETING MINUTES – February 12, 2020

PRESENT: Mayor Stephan Bradicich, Trustee Gail Lasher, Trustee Robert Scott, Trustee Amy Serrago and Trustee Dr. Josh Lipsman

#### **DEPARTMENT HEADS:**

- **Tal Rappleyea** – Village Attorney – absent.

## - Anthony Proper – DPW Director

Mr. Proper updated the VB on the DPW garage project. Archaeologist's have been completing the required digs. They have found nothing so far.

Mr. Proper would like permission to purchase 4 fire hydrants (replacing 4 hydrants) from Vellano Brothers for a total cost of \$23378.00. The money was budgeted last year for the current year.

A **MOTION** was made by Trustee Scott, seconded by Trustee Serrago, all in favor approving purchase of 4 hydrants from Vellano Brothers at a cost of \$23387.00.

Mr. Proper would also like to purchase 4 tires (state bid) at a total cost of \$1680.00 for the F450 Truck. Again, the money has been budgeted.

A **MOTION** was made by Trustee Lasher, seconded by Trustee Scott, all in favor approving purchase of 4 tires from Van Kleek's tires at a cost of \$1680.00.

Trustee Lasher mentioned that a resident on Union Street complained to her about the drainage. The VB discussed budgeting for projects like this and the Brick Row project.

## - David Disbrow - Fire Chief. Wayne Butterworth Assistant Chief Filled in

Provided a report of activity and expenses for the VB.

The Department would like to order the remaining sets of turnout gear as discussed previously. 2 Sets will be purchased.

A MOTION was made by Trustee Serrago, seconded by Trustee Lipsman, all in favor to purchase 2 sets of turn-out gear for the Athens Volunteer Fire Department.

### - Chief of Police Roger Masse – absent

#### - Mike Ragaini - Code Enforcement Officer

The Mayor discussed the status of several properties with the Code Enforcement Officer:

*Warren St.* – CEO stated the owner will be boarding up the property

*Montgomery St.* – CEO sent a violation notice and they did some clean up. The Mayor noted that it is not cleaned up much- stay on it.

Washington St. Automotive garage – CEO asked if he should write a ticket again. Mayor stated yes –  $2^{nd}$  violation. Be sure to document.

*Second St.* – Neighbor issue. Mayor instructed CEO to meet with the Village Attorney concerning this issue.

Trustee Lasher asked the CEO if he would look at the property next to the Food Studio. There is a safety issue with the rotting bilco door. They were cited once before and it is in bad shape again.

## - North Dome operations- Seth Mann and Joe Myers

Provided monthly report for both WWTP's and the WFP.

They also noted that the Annual contract for services has expired and they provided the new contract for signature.

They Mayor stated that he will review and get back to them.

WHEREAS that is relevant to the Village of Athens in that these projects could possibly case shoreline erosion on Sleepy Hollow Lake thereby creating hazardous condition for village residents and,

WHEREAS it has been suggested by Labarge Engineering that the village be registered as an interested party, along with the village and town of Coxsackie, through the permitting process to ensure the safety of the Village and,

WHEREAS costs for such venture may be reimbursable through the state as intervernor funding,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the village allocate \$9500.00 for engineering services provided by Labarge group to register the village of Athens as an interested party in all developments in these solar projects;

Trustee Serrago noted that she met with Trustee Lasher and they reviewed other community's policies on AirBnB's.

The Clerk-Treasurer noted again that the lease for the Fire Protection Contract with the Town has not been updated since 2018. The Town has paid the amount noted in the old contract this year, however the lease does need to be re-negotiated, renewed and signed by both parties.

The Clerk-Treasurer also noted that line items for the community center expenses are over-budget since the VB had anticipated conveying the building to the town 6 months into the village's fiscal year. That time has past.

The Mayor noted that he has spoken with Town Supervisor Rob Butler about finalizing the conveyance of the building and noted that final approval of conveyance of the building is dependent upon village approval of design of village space.

He also mentioned that he will discuss building expenses with the town as it was thought that the town was willing to share expenses if the conveyance was not timely.

The Village Board discussed the progress that the Farmer's Market has made for this Spring at the Riverfront Park.
